Appropriation - Indemnities - Reversions 1-2

These revenues are made under a voluntary agreement between the Department of Agriculture and the State of Arizona. A total of \$1,875,000 was expended during the fiscal year 1939-40 and \$1,813,450 covered to the General Fund.

When the condemnation of an animal the State Veterinarian makes an appraisal. The animal although diseased has a certain salvage value and is slaughtered and sold. The owner receives the salvage value direct from the purchaser and in addition receives two thirds of the difference between the appraised value and the salvage value. One half of the two thirds is paid the owner by the Federal Government and one half is paid by the State. The remaining one third is absorbed by the owner. The average indemnity payment from state funds, per animal was \$15.84.

FEDERAL FUNDS

The Federal Bureau of Animal Industry with district headquarters at Albuquerque, New Mexico, expended during the fiscal year 1939-40 a total of \$66,847.27 in Voluntary Bred's Disease contracts and in Animal Husbandry in Arizona.

A breakdown of the expenditures was not available but it is indicated that these expenditures exceeded state expenditures in each instance.

NARRATIVE

An appropriation of \$7,500.00 was made for the use of the State Veterinarian in matching Federal indemnity payments under the Voluntary Bang's Disease program.

These payments are made under a voluntary agreement between the board (Live Stock Sanitary Board) and the owner of affected dairy cattle. A total of \$5,876.55 was expended during the fiscal year 1939-40 and \$1,623.45 reverted to the General Fund.

Upon the condemnation of an animal the State Veterinarian makes an appraisal. The animal although diseased has a certain salvage value and is slaughtered and sold. The owner receives the salvage value direct from the purchaser and in addition, receives two thirds of the difference between the appraised value and the salvage value. One half of the two thirds is paid the owner by the Federal Government and one half is paid by the State. The remaining one third is absorbed by the owner. The average indemnity payment from state funds, per animal was \$15.84.

FEDERAL FUNDS

The Federal Bureau of Animal Industry with district headquarters at Albuquerque, New Mexico, expended during the fiscal year 1939-40 a total of \$46,847.27 in Voluntary Bang's Disease control and in Animal Husbandry in Arizona.
